PREFATORY NOTE

The five numbers of the *Wandering whore* appeared during 1660 and 1661. John Garfield, the publisher and probably the author, seized the opportunity presented by the licentiousness of the Restoration to exploit the reputation of Pietro Aretino's *La puttante errante*, notorious for its illustration of thirty-five erotic postures. Like most of the literature of this genre the *Wandering whore* takes a conversational form, two of the participants, Magdalena, the old bawd, and Julietta, a young whore, echoing Aretino's model. There are many other English examples. *The crafty whore or the misery and iniquity of bawdy-houses, laid open in a dialogue between two subtle bawds* (London, 1658), adapted from Aretino, provided both a precedent and a source (e.g. at Part II, pp. 11-12).

Following a tradition established as early as Robert Greene's 'coney-catching' pamphlets of the 1590s, the *Wandering whore* relates anecdotes of roguery and includes vignettes of lascivious practices, as usual ostensibly describing foreign manners — Julietta is Venetian — and excusing itself by the pretence of exposing them. (Note the exhortation on the title page, the advertisements and other apologia.) The work abounds in Rabelaisian humour, using puns and innuendo in describing sexual activities, its language is thick with contemporary military and naval metaphor.

As a result of the attempted suppression of prostitution at the Reformation, mentioned by Garfield, who cites John Stow's *Survey of London* (London, 1598), whoring in England was confined to backstreet, low-class establishments; on the continent courtesans might be accorded higher status. If the prices quoted here are accurate then the *Wandering whore* is somewhat up-market. Its list of streets noted for prostitution and brothels seems comprehensive (II, 9) and at least two of the women named were actually in the London trade. Damaris Page, 'the great bawd of the seamen' is mentioned by Pepys (*Diary*, vol. ix, ed. R. C. Latham and W. Matthews (London, 1976), p. 132 under 25 March 1668) and Madam Cresswell was convicted in November 1681 'after above thirty years practice of bawdry' (*The Impartial protestant mercury* No. 64, 29 November - 2 December, 1681. See also

The Poor-whores petition (London, 1668), and Tom Brown's *Amusements serious and comical*, ed. A. L. Hayward (London, 1927), p. 442).

The *Wandering whore* elicited several contemporary responses: it was ridiculed by Dr. John Heydon, the author of *Advice to a daughter*, writing as Eugenius Theodidactus, *The ladies champion*; a supposed Peter Aretine, Cardinal of Rome, also noticed it.

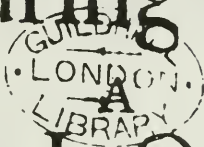
Few copies of the *Wandering whore* survive. Thomason collected numbers 2 to 4, which he dated 5, 12 and 19 December 1660; the Guildhall Library has copies of numbers 1 to 3; the Huntington holds numbers 1 and 5; and the Bodleian has at least number 5. Apparently the last issue was delayed by Garfield's imprisonment. In the *Sixth part of the wandering whore revived* (London, 1663, reputedly in the Bodleian but not traced) Eubulus (i.e., Garfield) says, 'I was committed to the Metropolitan Colledg of London [Newgate] upon a plea of trespass, for the non-payment of a hundred pound at the suit of one Gibson, where I continued 3 months before publishing the fifth part of the *Wandering-whore*'. The *Wandering whore* in its turn served as a model for later works including John Dunton's *Nightwalker* (1696-97). For information about the genre see Foxon's article cited above and Margaret Katanka, *Women of the underworld: a study of prostitution and women criminals in popular literature 1600-1700* (MA essay, University of Birmingham, 1973). See also J. Frank, *The Beginnings of the English newspaper*, (Cambridge, Mass., 1961).

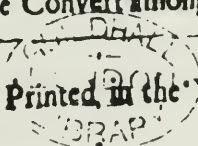

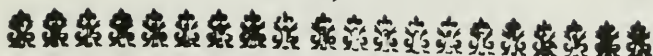

Magdal. **T**His full appearance of our Companions sets me all on fire, to talk a little bawdery and drollery amongst them: First, to shew the use of the Strummulo or Merkin. Secondly, The conveniency of Spunges. Thirdly, To have the Italian Padlock abolished. Fourthly, The Scorch-spui extirpated. Fifthly, The several Postures of Lancing, Backwards, Forwards, and every way discovered and introduced amongst us with more Freedom. Sixthly, all advantagious devices, subtilties, practices and Principles encouraged and strictly observed. Seventhly, The cure of the french pox and perillous infirmity of burning remedied, for encrease of the greater number of Clarify'd Wenchcs. Eighthly, For providing a common stock and revenue for rabby Gowns, carnation Petticoats, holland smocks, silk stockings, rich garters and white shoes, for our wanderers. Ninthly, for bringing in all the profitable Venetian Customs and Curtizans actions amongst us. Tenthly, That what Bastards and By-blows fall out amongst us, may be preferred for fear of *Bridewell*, *New-prison*, or *Tyburn*, the two common Pit falls of careles observers.

Fulvesta. Most exquisite Mutton, we all submit to your voice, and words, as the intallible Oracle, and rule

rule of Practice for us, to walk by, informeth that for my own part, whatever you command me to demonstrate concerning our Customs in Venice, I shall readily acquaint you with them.

Magdalen. I doubt not your ability or confidence therein, but I must direct my intended discourse to *Gusman* our Hector, and confer with you afterwards, in the mean while give ear, with the rest of the Sisterhood, to our discourses and pleadings, and for you, Senior *Gusman*, I expect your judgement and advice upon the preceding observations, delivered in your hearing.

Gusman. I tell you plainly that ever since I was a Loose-liver or gamester in the School of *Venus*, I never read nor heard of ten such exact precepts proposed by any person, and wherein I can be serviceable, either in advice or actions, it shall be my study, and endeavor to accomplish your Intents and purposes, therefore for such as have lost their hair off their commodities: I do conclude it necessary for them to have a false strummulo or merkin, for such as fear the french Pox or perilous infirmity of burning, I advise not to do the business without sponges: the jealous Italian padlock is improper for persons of your profession: the scotch spur there is no need of amongst you, being forward enough without them: the several postures are necessary, because all men do not affect one and the same riding; And for Encouragements amongst us, luxurious feeding, lascivious actions, wanton gestures, fine and clean Linen, Holland Smocks, with good outsides are the chiefest provocatives in those practises: the french Pox is nothing amongst Friends, therefore No Cure, no Money, shall have

have their Custom, the provision for tempting habits, I like well, with the Venetian Curtezans practises, especially in this point, where they take care to educate all Bastards, both Priests, Merchants and peasants, without enquiry after the father, for I fancy not the commencement in *Bridewel* or *Newgate*, for such venial offences, which in former days have been tolerated by our Predecessors, and at this day by our neighbors.

Magdalen How, tolerated by our Predecessors? I never heard that before, what Author did you finde that intelligence in? I must deal plainly with you, I cannot beleve any such thing remains upon Record.

Gusman. I will quickly convince you of your error, or ignorance, for in the 337 page of *Londinopolis*, you may read how the Bordel or Stew-houses were privileged for the repair of incontinent men & women, by the supream Governours, wherein is observable these orders amongst the Stew holders: That no single woman should take mony of any man for lying with her, except she lay with him all night till the morrow: That no Stew-holder should keep a single woman in his house, that had the perilous infirmity of burning, with diverse others: where note, there was the *Clink* for the imprisoning such as abused those houses, and neer adjoining, a place peculiar to them called the *single-womans church-yard*, wherein they were buried, if they did not repent of their sinful life: And these allowed houses, had these several signs painted on the fronts of their walls towards the *Thames*, a *Bores-head*, the *Cross-eyes*, the *Gun*, the *Castle*, the *Crane*, *Cardinals Hat*, the *Bell*, the *Swan* &c.

Magdalen. Senior *Gusman*, our beloved Friend, and vali-

valiant Hector, you are for perpetual in your observations, that I must, and do ~~blame~~ you, and therefore desire against our next meeting, that such of their orders as are omitted, may be revived and rehearsed amongst us, for the satisfaction of these Gentlewomen, and what may be deemed profitable amongst us, practised, resolving from the Poulterers wives cries, *Nomony, no Cony*; a Cunny being the dearest piece of flesh in the whole world, witness *Priss Fotheringhams* Chuck-office, where upon fight thereof, French Dollars, Spanish Pistols, English Half-crowns are as plentifully pour'd in, as the Rhenish wine was into the Dutch wenches two hoses till she roar'd again, as she was showing tricks upon her head with naked buttocks and spread legs in a round ring, like those at wrestling near the Half-crown-chuck-office, call'd *Sack-a-wenberries six windmills*.

Gusman. I assure you she that had the half Crowns chucked into her Comodity, had lesser harm than the Rhenish wine Wench, for its of a smarting and searching quality, differing from that Sack was poured in on one side by such Callies as *Priss Fotheringhams*, and sack't out on the other, which is a new fashioned Cup for roaring boyes to drink in.

Magdalen. That was a mad trick more then ever I do played or heard of, and yet I have seen many, amongst which I remember this one that was committed upon one of my familiar acquaintance, who was so deeply drunk with Sack, Claret, Beer, Ale and Tobacco; that they took her and layed her belly naked upon a Table, like as if she had been layed out for buryal, ~~chucking~~, or sticking a Candle in her Comodity, and drinking

drinking healths over the dead drunk party, til the mercilefs Candle fir'd her Fur-buth quite away, the flame whereof was quickly abated by drawing a codpiece engine, and giving her two or three Coolers.

Gusman. One of the maddest tricks, that ever I saw acted, was this (but not in a drunken humor, as such are when they drink Strain'd Sack, thorough our Madams Smocks till they drop again) upon a handsom neat Clean skin'd Girl that was terribly pepper'd with herds of Crabblice (as v sible in her tayl as Cloves in a gammon of Bacon) whose torment was so exceeding great, that an intimate Friend of hers discovered her distemper, and with much perswasions and intreaties made her hearken to the meanes and remedies following; whereupon he took her and ty'd her up naked at the bods feet by the middle like a monkey, and lighting a pipe of Tobacco gave those many-tooted vermin (arising from inbred Lechery) such a rout at her Cinque ports, by thrusting in the small end of his pipe into one hole, then into the other, blowing the smoke at the other end of his Pipe, that they never durst venture to inhabit those Continents since. But to add to this frolick, the knoke occasioned such a squirt, that the heat and fury thereof scalded this Gentlemans beard cleer away from his chin, far worse then hot Quodlins; since which mischance he could never endure peeping in wenches Arseholes, lest the next bout, they should piss his eyes out.

Magdalen. If there is a piece of Roguery in the world, thou hast it to a hunds bredth, which is just the same proportion at Narrow-bridg, where so many passengers croud and thrust to enter one after another.

Gusman. That's the place where 1500 pike-men were routed and put to the worst on't, the newes where-of came of a truth from *Dunkirk*: But what's your usual way to delude and entice yong men, and coakes them of their mony and affections.

Magdaalen. Here's none but are old beaten Soldiers at that sport, and as easy with them as pissing backwards, and that is onely drying their flowers to powder, and then giving it in posset Drink, and it hits effectually; another way is to take the largest and foundest Nutmeg ty'd in a string, and thrust up to be soundly soak't and pickl'd in their Whib-bob for 3 or 4 nights together, which being grated into a Cup of Ale with a toast, intoxicates the beautiful to doat on the most deformed; but this must be spoken under the Rose, for fear the too frequent prating hereof should bring us to deserved punishment for unlawful practises.

Gusman. Methinks *Magdalena* you have tyr'd me out of breath, pray take to task *Iuliessa* the most beautiful piece in City, Court, or Country, for were she not so, she were not fit to let her loving Kindness come down so often; I will not say (in the pernicious gibberish of deformed Cullender fac'd, rubify'd and carbuncled faces) be a whore, for Whores are ever the pleasanest and handsomest, if not wholsomest.

Magdaalen. Tis no great matter for wholsom: Mony's good for the wholsom's what say you *Iuliessa*, will you be free to be a whore under me, I will warrant you Customers, and constant Comrades of gold and silver?

Iuliessa. I am unwilling to be a whore under you, but under an able and sufficient man; I am, and ever was willing.

Magdalen. I am glad to hear you find a quibbling Critick, you'll fit my purpose, and serve for your own profit; I know you know as well where to stick a prick to make flesh swell, as e're a Butcher taught by baudy *Priapus*: I would fain know the fashion of the Italian Padlock; which makes so many honest women against their wills, and remit our further discourse to the next meeting.

Fulietta. The Italian Padlock, are made of Iron, Steel and silver, gilt over, sometimes covered with Plush or Velvet, which goes quite round their Lips, a thin plate going between their Legs like a Cullinder or Grate to piss thorough, over their Whib-bobs the Lock hangs fastned under their smocks near the groin of the back, and never opened but when her husband hath a mind to play a game at Tick-tack, as *Vulcan* did with *Venus*.

Franston. 'Tis not the first time I have had a Girl of your chusing, 'fayth, let me give her hansel, you know I am a very handsom-body'd man in the face, and let her try whether an Italian or a French P— is longest, and best pleasing.

Magdalen. Seignor *Gusman*, conduct them into my Bed-chamber, furnish them with good Wine and Tobacco, for I know *Ju.* will smoke a pipe, and then tois his Pike, see they want no attendance nor a Chamber-pot, that which the one pisses, the other my hold the Pot.

Gusman. An excellent way to raise lechery: I will attend my Customers, and mind my trade.

Magdalen. Dear Sisters, I must now direct my present thoughts and words to your purposes, and then
B conclude

conclude till our next opportunity of meeting, where-
 in you shall be more peculiarly concern'd than at this
 present: My advice therefore to you (that keep Dan-
 cing-Schools) to keep handfom likely trapping Wen-
 ches that will throw their Legs over mens heads, and
 show all for nothing, always in readiness, and good
 clothes on their backs, to have the better price for their
 Commodities: For you that wander through *Cheap-
 side*, the old *Exchange*, *Cornehil*, and *Leaden hall*, *Street*,
 let your rendezvouz be sometime at *Mrs. Adams* in
Long-Ally, sometime at the *Rose* in *Maorfields*, at *Mrs.
 Jones's*, but use not that gulkom of picking mens pocket-
 ers whilst they are groping your plackets too often;
 and if you are in the road towards *Fleet-Street*, *Mrs.
 Simpson* in *Ram-Ally* will furnish you with fit rooms to
 do the business in. I know for your part *Priss*, you have
 much Custom, and for Wenches and good neighbors
 continual supply from the *White-Cross*, the *London-
 prentice*, the *Ship*, with the rest of the row; for you *Mrs.
 Creswel* at the upper end of *Maorfields* in a back *Ally*, I
 hear you admit of very few but Citizens, and Citizens
 wives, whose Pictures you keep in readiness for your
 best Customers to chuse on, and trade with, and you
 Doctor *Sherbys* wife in *Garden-alley* in *St. James's*,
 you ought not to be a whore and baud to your own

Bell-Ringer with a plaister'd Picture will content you, your mony's as good as any others there, and for this time I bid you all adieu.

Gusman. *Magdalena*, Mounfieur *Francion* desir'd to speak with you as soon as you had dispatcht your female society, I stood pimping and peeping at their door, till I heard the bargain driven betwixt them, and *Juliessa* to enhance the price of her Comodity, perswaded him no man-kinde had either seen or felt her ware since her arrival in *England*, he gave her forty shillings, and a gold ring beset with diamonds, before they went to't; for she told him, for whores and Hackney Jades, their hire must be payd before stricing them, so that by that time his reckoning is payd for, the joyes in his pocket will leave quarrelling.

Magdalen. If he cannot pay his Reckoning without scoring, I must have one of his Gold-Rings; Watch, or Cloak as a pledge for his Reckoning, for I will not trust him much longer then *Juliessa*, with whom I would speak ere I see him, therefore call her hither, for should she care a T— for him now she has got his mony; she would be thought too common; besides, if another gallant Cutly should step in, she must be ready to hold forth to him also; but she must lay aside her mony and trust to no pockets or purse, but that which is cut between her Legs.

Gusman. Ile call her instantly, Ho, Ho, here she comes without calling or sending for, and sav'd the messenger (not hangman) a labor.

Magdalen. You look very merry upon't *Ju*, surely you have been well payd, and pleased with your recreation.

Fulietta. Were such recreation for to hold but one twelve-month together; I would not change my occupation, to be the richest Common-councils man's wife in *London*.

Magdalen. If the trade were as constant and certain, as it is profitable, there would fewer whores go to the *Berbadoes* and *Virginia*, and the tribe lesser in *New-prison*, *Bridewel*, *Compter*; and *New-gate*, where nothing but poverty and the non-payment of Keepers fees, detains them for the most part from their enlargement; but how lik't you the Combate upon your back and belly with *Francion*?

Fulietta. Passing well, for he pass't and repass't very pleasantly, and was mighty tender of me; for lest he should put me to too much pain, or endanger beating the bottom of my belly-out, he wrapt an Ell of *Holland* neer the root of his P— but I snatch't it off, and cool'd his courage quickly.

Magdalen. By *Mars*, *Vulkan*, *Venus*, and *Priapus*, it was nobly done, but did you piss presently after your work was over, to prevent his getting you with Childe, for he could not chuse but do it with a good will, on conceit of getting your Maiden-head.

Fulietta: My Maiden-head? He that think's I had my Maiden head after thirteen, has had a knock in the Cradle, and merits cutting of the Simples, but I settled on the Chamber-pot as soon as ever he was off, till I made it whurra, and roar like the Tyde at *London-Bridge*, to the endangering the breaking of my very Twailing-strings with straining backwards; for I know no better way or remedy more safe then pissing presently to prevent the French Pox, Gonorrhoea, the perilous

rilous infirmity of Burning, or getting with Childe, which is the approved maxim amongst Venetian Courtiers and Curtezana's.

Magdalen. I remember two lusty, strapping, bouncing Girles, whose names were *Leda* and *Lycanium*, each of them married to a bed-full of old bones, with which they could not be satisfi'd, so that *Leda* counterfeits her self sick, the old dotard presses her to know her distemper, which she told him was occasioned for want of due benevolence, he knowing his insufficiency and impotency, grants her desires, and by the help of a well-trap't Doctor, was perfectly cured. *Lycanium* went more cunningly to work, for watching her oportunity upon a false pretence, seduced and deluded a lusty ruddy coloured shepherd into the middle of a wood, where catching hold of his trap-stick, she, (when she saw him stiff and strong, and itching to be at her,) taught the unskilful rustick to loose his maiden-head by guiding him to her fancy.

Fulsissa. I knew a person of great beauty and quality, who whilst she was playing a game at Whisk or Pickquet with her husband, a Gentleman got her upon his knee, and plaid a game at Tick-tack, on one side of the table before her husbands face, without being discovered.

Magdalen. If that work be done with a good will, 'tis as easy to dispatch it, during an *Exchange* time, as an *East-India Voyage*, as many a Merchant have found to their sorrow, yet such as blow their horns on that point deserve pointing at, and such as put them in their pockets, deserve pitying.

Fulietta. **C**ome (sweet heart) wilt thou do-a-little, the fits come on me now, I will show thee a pure pair of naked breasts, smooth Buttocks, Lovely and ivory thighs whiter than untrod Snow, with the best red-lip't C—in *Christendom*, such as *Europa* never showed *Jupiter*, *Orithya Boreas*, nor *Helena Theſeus*, when they cornuted their husbands, nor at the Wraſtling amongſt the naked *Roman* virgins.

Francion. You are huge merry me-thinks *Fulietta*, the news and ſight whereof would tempt a ſaint. eſpecially ſuch a one as I am, therefore lye down dear heart and make my P—riſe, diſcloſe thy curled, ſilver-colour'd turn-pikes and perfum'd Cabinet lyes in thy vally ſweeter than Violets; then lead me with thy ivory fingers to it's fancy, where I will enter it's Port with a full ſpring tyde between thy bum's riding ſafe at Anchor within thy harbour.

Julietta. I know what pleases me best, and which displeases me most, for I am not like the old E—of E—C—unpentrable, or troubl'd with a narrow passage, but like to *Mal. Savory*, who sitting in a publick passage in a very good habit and rich apparel about twilight, lay lamenting the loss of her husband she never had, (though children several,) A kind hearted Gentleman passing by, with little importunity treated her into a Tavern where drinking two or three pints of Canary, she related her distresses and distractions with

Magdel. Gusman, I would have you forbear these common *Whores* for a season, unless upon some remarkable passages and occasions; for the *private Whores* trade spoils that of ours, so that we have little or no trading among us; for there's one *Margery S---* keeps

C--- her *Stallion*, who was wont to be a good Customer, till she got him into her clutches, & *inter clunes*, well might his wife *Bess* turn *whore* for want of *due benevolence*, and other necessaries, whilest he lay soaking and sopping of himself in the rayl of such a *Tawny-Moor*, whose luxury and lechery is as *insatiate as the sea*: He record her actions my self, and put her in my *Black Remembrancer*: Mrs *Huzzly* will tell you the very same. Then there's Mrs. *Holl---* who were it not for beggery and poverty, would not be unprovided so much as she is, and be glad of other folks leavings. Then there's Mrs. *Nettleton*, Mrs. *B---* and Mrs. *C---* who must needs have their Friends in private, oh these Friends are brave fellows, when a Gold Ring with a Diamond in't, appears to clear their eye-sight! or such a *silver Tanker* as was given a Shop-keepers wife in *Cheapside*, to be tickled by a *declining Gamester*, whose wife has more need on't between her own sheets: *oh! the sacred hunger of gold, it overcomes all things.*

Gus. There's no reason but they should be brought upon the stage as well as others, and their private whoredoms discovered; for I have known several of them will hire men to do their drudgery and pay them according to their performances, who must not be omitted; these are seeming chaste and modest Virgins by day, but notorious whores by night: *Quæ cum foris sunt nihil mundius*, but what they commit in private, shall be published and proclaimed upon the house tops, but I blame their uxorious husbands, who suffer themselves to be rid and trode upon by their insolent wives, the *pride* of women evermore causing dotage in men: Did not *Menelaus* resolve to be the Executioner

tioner of his wifes miscarriages and mischiefs, when upon sight of her proportioned Limbs, tender and delicate Body, white Skin, rich Habillments, effeminate and mimic Gestures, they charm'd his chaste eyes, and deafish ears, wherein is seen the impotency, weakness, and violence of Venereal Love, which so much overturneth reason in men.

But see the fruits of this bad tree, from which could come no good, and commonly such as the Parents be, such are the children, *the Crows egg is no better than the Crow her self*: was not *Helena* after all her whoredoms, incest with her son in law, cruel murder of her other husband *Deiphobus* (after her flight to *Polyxena* Queen one of her old acquaintance) taken out of her Chamber by the Queens servants stark-naked, as she was bathing and washing her self, in abhorrency and detestation of such a Monster, and hang'd on a tree as an ignominious spectacle to all persons. *Europa*, she doted so much upon a Bull, that she got upon his back astride, to have her lechery satisfied. *Pasiphae*, unnatural and wicked in her thoughts and actions, lov'd a Bull, of whom he begot a *Minotaure*, being *Proles biformis veneris monumenta nefanda*. There are likewise *Hermaphrodites*, effeminate men, men given to much luxury, idleness, and wanton pleasures, and to that abominable sin of *Sotomy*, wherein they are both active and passive in it, whose vicious actions are onely to be whisper'd amongst us.
